


Oil and Gas Prices 2008 – 2019





Petrochemical Prices (Ammonia, Urea and Methanol)




GDP, Inflation and Unemployment 2008 - 2019




Total Revenues, Energy & Non-Energy Revenues





Revenue from Taxation (excluding oil) 2008 - 2020






Oil Revenue as a % of Total Revenue (2008-2020)














Subsidy on Petroleum Products (2009-2019)

Debt Service/Revenue 2007-2019




Patterns of Expenditure, Revenue & Overall Balance 2007 – 2020




